Standard 1: Accessing Information

Benchmark 1: Understands basic organizational pattern of library	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Expands definition of the difference between fiction (picture books and chapter books) and nonfiction (biographies and <i>folktales</i>) to include all sections of the library.• Recognizes call number and begins to understand grouping of material by call number, including subject organization.
Benchmark 2: Locates parts of a book	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Identifies author, title, illustrator, title page, cover, spine and call number.

Standard 2: Evaluating Information

Benchmark 1: Differentiates between fact and fiction.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Draws a conclusion about the main idea.
Benchmark 2: Finds facts in more than one source.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Introduction to headings, table of contents, captions and index.• Identifies that information comes from a variety of sources, including nonfiction books, websites, magazines and encyclopedias.

Standard 3: Using Information

Benchmark 1: Communicates results of information search in appropriate format and understands the need for citing sources.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Begins to organize information into different forms independently (sequencing, drawn story response and categorizing).• Introduction to the need for citing sources and begins to make simple bibliographies (author and title).
Benchmark 2: Observes Internet guidelines and protocols as defined in the district's policies.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Continued introduction to the concepts of evaluation, advertising, manners and safety online.

Standard 4: Appreciating Literature

Benchmark 1: Uses both text and visuals to understand literature	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Increases understanding of literature by participating in group discussion (opinions and responses, compare/contrast, inferences and predictions).• Is acquainted with <i>award-winning literature</i> (focus on Caldecott).
Benchmark 2: Distinguishes between different types and elements of literature	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Reads, listens, and views traditional world literature/<i>folklore</i> (focus on <i>Fairy Tales</i>) and <i>multicultural literature</i>.• Reads or listens to nonfiction (focus on biographies).• Increases understanding of literary elements of plot, character, setting and point of view.
Benchmark 3: Selects a " <i>Just Right</i> " book independently for personal reading	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Applies the guidelines for choosing a "<i>Just Right</i>" book during literature selection.• Reads or listens to types of fiction in picture book and novel format (focus on series fiction)
